For more on our new ALUMNI HIRES, recently approved NEW MASTER'S OPTIONS, and a goodbye to someone you all remember, keep reading!

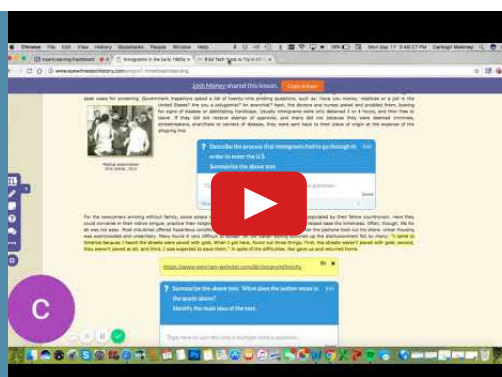
